OCCUPIED BY A PERSON WHO DIED OR HAD A SERIOUS ILLNESS.
The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
Section 1. Chapter 39 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new
Article to read:
"ARTICLE 9.
"DISCLOSURE.
"§ 39-50. No duty to disclose death or illness.
A person offering real property for sale does not have a duty to disclose to a
prospective purchaser that the real property was previously occupied by a person who
died or had a serious illness while residing on the property unless such information is
specifically requested by the potential purchaser."
Sec. 2. Article 1 of Chapter 42 of the General Statutes is amended by adding
a new section to read:
"§ 42-14.1. No duty to disclose death or illness.

A person offering real property for rent or lease does not have a duty to disclose to a

prospective tenant or lessee that the real property was previously occupied by a person

who died or had a serious illness while residing on the property unless such information

is specifically requested by the potential renter or lessee."

Sec. 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 1989, and shall apply to acts or omissions occurring on or after that date.
