5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
6	Section 1. Chapter 163 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new		
7	section to read:		
8	"§ 163-278.13A. No fund-raising for legislators or Council of State members while		
9	General Assembly is in session during odd-numbered year.		
10	(a) While the General Assembly is in regular session during any odd-numbered		
11	year, an individual or political committee may not make a contribution to:		
12	(1) <u>A member of the Council of State;</u>		
13	(2) <u>A member of the General Assembly; or</u>		
14	(3) <u>A political committee the principal purpose of which is to support or</u>		
15	assist a member or members of the Council of State or a member or		
16	members of the General Assembly.		
17	(b) <u>A member of the Council of State, a member of the General Assembly, or a</u>		
18	political committee the principal purpose of which is to support or assist a member or		
19	members of the Council of State or a member or members of the General Assembly		
20	may not solicit or accept a contribution during the period prescribed by subsection (a).		
21	(c) This section does not apply to any contribution made to or by a State, county		
22	or district executive committee of a political party. This section does not apply to a		
23	contribution that was made and accepted with the intent that it be used:
