5	The General Ass	sembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	Sectio	on 1. G.S. 20-129(a) reads as rewritten:
7	"(a) When	Vehicles Must Be Equipped Every vehicle upon a highway within
8	this State shall	be equipped with lighted headlamps and rear lamps as required for
9	different classes	of vehicles, and subject to exemption with reference to lights on parked
10	vehicles as decla	ared in G.S. 20-134:
11	(1)	During the period from sunset to sunrise,
12	(2)	When there is not sufficient light to render clearly discernible any
13		person on the highway at a distance of 400 feet ahead, or
14	(3) -	When the lack of visibility through the windshield requires the
15		windshield wipers to be activated and the vehicle is within a school
16		zone during the regular school hours of the school year.
17	<u>(4)</u>	At any other time when windshield wipers are in use as a result of
18		smoke, fog, rain, sleet, or snow, or when inclement weather or
19		environmental factors severely reduce the ability to clearly discern
20		persons and vehicles on the street and highway at a distance of 500
21		feet ahead, provided, however, the provisions of this subdivision shall
22		not apply to instances when windshield wipers are used intermittently

1	in misting rain, sleet, or snow. Any person violating this subdivision
2	during the period from October 1, 1989, through December 31, 1990,
3	shall be given a warning of the violation only. Thereafter, any person
4	violating this subdivision shall have committed an infraction and shall
5	pay a fine of five dollars (\$5.00) and shall not be assessed court costs.
6	No drivers license points or insurance points shall be assessed on
7	account of violation of this subdivision and no negligence or liability
8	shall be assessed on or imputed to any party on account of a violation
9	of this subdivision. The Commissioner of Motor Vehicles and the
10	Superintendent of Public Instruction shall incorporate into driver
11	education programs and driver licensing programs instruction designed
12	to encourage compliance with this subdivision as an important means
13	of reducing accidents by making vehicles more discernible during
14	periods of limited visibility."
15	Sec. 2. This act shall become effective October 1, 1989.
