The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
Section 1. Article 26 of Chapter 14 of the General Statutes is amended by
adding a new section to read:
"§ 14-196.3. Using profane language on school premises.
It shall be unlawful for any person to use any words or language of a profane,
vulgar, lewd, or lascivious character, nature, or connotation on the premises of an
elementary or secondary school and in the presence of a minor. It shall also be unlawful
for any person to use any words or language which threaten, intimidate, coerce, or
constitute fighting words on the premises of an elementary or secondary school and in
constitute righting words on the premises of an elementary of secondary school and in

presence of a minor. A violation of this section is a misdemeanor punishable by a fine
