## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2 AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE LEGISLATIVE RESEARCH COMMISSION TO
3 STUDY THE NEED FOR, AND MOST APPROPRIATE MANNER OF,
4 DEVELOPING, TRAINING, AND FUNDING HAZARDOUS MATERIAL
5 RESPONSE TEAMS THROUGHOUT THE STATE.

6 Whereas, it is required that technical response teams, referred to as 7 HAZMAT teams, be available to each county within the State to provide expertise in 8 handling hazardous material situations; Now, therefore,

9 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

10 Section 1. The Legislative Research Commission may study the immediate 11 and future needs for forming, training, and funding hazardous material response teams, 12 known as HAZMAT teams, throughout the State of North Carolina. The study may 13 include, among other issues, a detailed examination of response capabilities of various 14 agencies now in existence, the effect of federal and State legislation, and any factors 15 that would provide for an orderly and effective implementation of any recommended 16 legislation.

17 Sec. 2. The Commission shall report its findings, together with any 18 recommended legislation, to the 1989 General Assembly (1990 Regular Session).

Sec. 3. This act is effective upon ratification.
