A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO PROHIBIT HUNTING FROM ROADS AND TO REGULATE HUNTING AND FISHING ON PRIVATE LANDS IN ALAMANCE AND ROCKINGHAM COUNTIES.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. It is unlawful to hunt, take, or kill any wild animal or wild bird, or to attempt to hunt, take, or kill any wild animal or wild bird on, from, or across the right-of-way of any public road, street, highway, or thoroughfare in Alamance or Rockingham Counties.

Sec. 2. It is unlawful to hunt with, or possess a firearm or bow on another's land, or to fish on another's land, without the written, dated permission of the owner or lessee of land, unless the land has been leased for hunting. The written permission must have been obtained within the year prior to the date of entry onto the land, and must be carried on the person; if permission is given to a group of hunters, it is sufficient that the organizer of the hunt or his designee have a copy of the written permission. The granting of permission to hunt on land pursuant to this section shall not subject the owner or lessee to increased liability.

Sec. 3. The immediate family of the owner or lessee of land is exempt from the provisions of this act, unless the owner or lessee has notified them by certified mail that they do not have permission to hunt on the land. For purposes of this act, "immediate family"shall include the spouse of the owner or lessee, and the children, grandchildren, parents, grandparents, and siblings of the owner or lessee or the spouse of the owner or lessee.

Sec. 4. Violation of this act is a misdemeanor, punishable for a first conviction by a fine of not less than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) or by imprisonment not to exceed 30 days, and punishable for a subsequent conviction within three years by a fine of not less than three hundred dollars (\$300.00), by imprisonment not to exceed 90 days, or by both.

- Sec. 5. This act is enforceable by law enforcement officers of the Wildlife Resources Commission, by sheriffs and deputy sheriffs, and by other peace officers with general subject matter jurisdiction.
- Sec. 6. Chapter 206 of the 1971 Session Laws is repealed. Prosecutions for violations of Chapter 206 of the 1971 Session Laws occurring before October 1, 1989, are not abated or affected by this act, and Chapter 206 of the 1971 Session Laws remains applicable to those prosecutions.
 - Sec. 7. This act applies only to Alamance and Rockingham Counties.
- Sec. 8. This act shall become effective October 1, 1989.
