A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO CREATE BUFFER ZONES NEAR LANDFILLS IN LARGE
COUNTIES.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. G.S. 130A-295.1(b), which expired June 30, 1987, as provided by
Section 210 of Chapter 757, Session Laws of 1987, is reenacted and reads as rewritten:

"(b) The Department of Human Resources may not issue a permit for a sanitary
landfill, as defined in G.S. 130A-290(16), to or for a county with a population of four
hundred thousand or more, or to or for any incorporated city, town, or village in that
county, if the landfill is to be located:

(1) ~~within~~ Within any other county, without the approval of the board of
county commissioners of the county where the landfill is to be located;

or

(2) Within one mile of any other county, without the approval of the board
of county commissioners of the county which the landfill is to be
located within one mile of, provided that if the landfill is to be within
one mile of two other counties, then the boards of commissioners of
both those counties must approve."

Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification.
