A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2 AN ACT TO DECRIMINALIZE THE POSSESSION OF CERTAIN LOTTERY 3 TICKETS.

4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. G.S. 14-291.1 reads as rewritten:

6 "§ 14-291.1. Selling 'numbers' tickets; possession prima facie evidence of violation. Except in connection with a lawful raffle as provided in Part 2 of this Article, if any 7 person shall sell, barter or cause to be sold or bartered any ticket, token, certificate or 8 9 order for any number or shares in any lottery, commonly known as the numbers or butter and egg lottery, or lotteries of similar character, to be drawn or paid within or 10 without the State, such person shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall be punished 11 by fine or imprisonment, or both, in the discretion of the court. Any person who shall 12 have in his possession any tickets, certificates or orders used in the operation of any 13 such lottery, except for lottery tickets legally sold in the state where purchased, shall be 14 guilty under this section, and the possession of such tickets shall be prima facie 15 evidence of the violation of this section." 16

17 Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification.
