A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO REPEAL A LOCAL ACT FREEZING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE MONROE CITY SCHOOL ADMINISTRATIVE UNIT.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. (a) Chapter 189, Session Laws of 1979, is repealed. This revives Section 1(c) of Chapter 735, Session Laws of 1971.

(b) Any area annexed to the corporate limits of the City of Monroe with an effective date beginning March 23, 1979, and ending June 30, 1991, shall become part of the Monroe City School Administrative Unit on July 1, 1991.

(c) With the approval of the Superintendents of the two units, any person who, at the end of the 1990-91 school term, was a student in the ninth grade or above in the Union County School Administrative Unit, and subsections (a) or (b) of this section changes the residence of that person from the Union County School Administrative Unit to the Monroe City School Administrative Unit, that person may continue attending schools in the Union County School Administrative Unit notwithstanding the change in boundaries, as long as that person continues to reside at that residence. In such case, the Union County School Administrative Unit is not obligated to provide transportation to that person.

(d) Transfer of any territory from the Union County School Administrative Unit to the Monroe City School Administrative Unit under this section does not affect the title to or right to possession and use of the Shiloh School or the Career Center by the Union County School Administrative Unit.

Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification.
