A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR VARIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAMS.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Youth and Family Counselling Service the sum of \$80,000 for the 1991-92 fiscal year and the sum of \$80,000 for the 1992-93 fiscal year, to allow the Service to continue the Grimes Alternative School Model Program, a community-based alternatives program for undisciplined juveniles in the public schools in Davidson County.

Section 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to Bringing It All Back Home Study Center at Appalachian State University the sum of \$40,000 for the 1991-92 fiscal year, and the sum of \$40,000 for the 1992-93 fiscal year, to allow the Center to continue its home remedies community-based alternatives program for undisciplined juveniles and their families.

Section 3. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the McDowell County Board of Education the sum of \$50,000 for the 1991-92 fiscal year and the sum of \$50,000 for the 1992-93 fiscal year to allow the Board to continue the McSmiles Program. The purpose of the program is to work with at-risk, preschool-aged children and their parents so as to prevent truancy, high dropout rates, and discipline problems and increase parental involvement.

Section 4. This act becomes effective July 1, 1991.
