A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT TO BRING THE GATES COUNTY SCHOOLS WASTEWATER SYSTEM  
2 INTO COMPLIANCE WITH STATE AND FEDERAL WASTEWATER  
3 REGULATIONS.

5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

6 Section 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Gates County  
7 Board of Education the sum of forty-seven thousand dollars (\$47,000) for the 1992-93  
8 fiscal year. These funds shall be used along with funds made available to the Gates  
9 County Board of Education in Section 32 of Chapter 799 of the 1989 Session Laws to  
10 bring the Gates County High School's and Gates County Junior High School's  
11 wastewater systems into compliance with State and federal wastewater regulations. All  
12 of these funds not needed for this purpose shall revert to the General Fund upon  
13 completion of the project.

14 Sec. 2. Section 120 of Chapter 1066 of the 1989 Session Laws reads as  
15 rewritten:

16 "Sec. 120. The Department of Correction shall permit the Gates County Board of  
17 Education to tie the wastewater treatment systems of the Gates County Junior High  
18 School and the Gates County High School ~~may be tied~~ into the wastewater treatment  
19 system of the Gates County Correctional Center.

20 The Gates County Board of Education shall use funds made available to it under  
21 Section 1 of this act to pay the Department of Correction the actual cost, up to forty  
22 thousand dollars (\$40,000), of enlarging the correctional center's spray field to  
23 accommodate the schools' needs. The Department of Correction shall not charge the  
24 Gates County Board of Education any additional amounts for the construction.

- 1 operation, or maintenance of the wastewater treatment system of the Gates County  
2 Correctional Center."  
3           Sec. 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 1992.
