2	AN ACT TO ENCOURAGE THE BUSINESS COMMUNITY TO FACILITATE
3	STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	Section 1. G.S. 115C-47 is amended by adding a new subdivision to read:
6	"(34) To encourage the business community to facilitate student
7	achievement Local boards of education, in consultation with
8	local business leaders, shall develop voluntary guidelines relating
9	to after-school employment. The guidelines may include an
10	agreement to limit the number of hours a student may work or to tie
11	the number of hours a student may work to his academic
12	performance, school attendance, and economic need. Local boards
13	of education shall compare the school performance of students who
14	work for employers who follow the guidelines and of students who
15	work for employers who do not follow the guidelines. Local
16	boards of education shall report the results of the comparison to the
17	State Board of Education before July 31 of each year beginning
18	with July 31, 1993, and the State Board of Education shall report
19	the statewide results to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight
20	Committee before September 30 of each year beginning with
21	<u>September 30, 1993.</u>

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1	Local boards of education shall work with local business leaders to
2	encourage employers to provide parents with time to attend
3	conferences with their children's teachers.
4	The Superintendent of Public Instruction shall provide guidance
5	and technical assistance to the local boards of education on carrying
6	out the provisions of this subdivision."
7	Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification.
