1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO ENCOURAGE THE BUSINESS COMMUNITY TO FACILITATE
3	STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	Section 1. G.S. 115C-47 is amended by adding a new subdivision to read:
6	"(34) To encourage the business community to facilitate student
7	achievement Local boards of education, in consultation with
8	local business leaders, shall develop voluntary guidelines relating
9	to after-school employment. The guidelines may include an
10	agreement to limit the number of hours a student may work or to tie
11	the number of hours a student may work to his academic
12	performance, school attendance, and economic need. The General
13	Assembly finds that local boards of education do not currently have
14	information regarding how many of their students are employed
15	after school and how many hours they work; the General Assembly
16	urges local boards of education to compile this critical information
17	so that the State can determine to what extent these students' work
18	affects their school performance.
19	Local boards of education shall work with local business leaders to
20	encourage employers to provide parents or guardians with time to
21	attend conferences with their children's teachers.

1	The Superintendent of Public Instruction shall provide guidance and
2	technical assistance to the local boards of education on carrying out the
3	provisions of this subdivision.
4	Local boards of education shall report their actions taken to
5	implement this subdivision to the State Board of Education before
6	April 1, 1992, and the State Board of Education shall report the actions
7	taken statewide to implement this subdivision to the Joint Legislative
8	Education Oversight Committee before May 1, 1992. The General
9	Assembly directs The University of North Carolina Board of
10	Governors to study the effects of after school employment on the
11	academic performance of North Carolina high school students and to
12	report the results of this study to the Joint Legislative Education
13	Oversight Committee before May 1, 1992."
14	Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification.
