## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

## AN ACT TO PROHIBIT OPEN CONTAINERS OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES IN

 MOTOR VEHICLES EXCEPT FOR MOTOR HOMES AND CERTAIN FORHIRE VEHICLES.The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
Section 1. G.S. 18B-401(a) reads as rewritten:
"(a) Opened Containers. - It shall be unlawful for a person to transport fertified wine or spirituous liquor or possess alcoholic beverages in the passenger area of a motor vehicle in other than the manufacturer's unopened original container while the vehicle is in operation on a highway or public vehicular area. It shall also be unlawful for any person to consume alcoholic beverages in the passenger area of a motor vehicle while the vehicle is in operation on a highway or public vehicular area. It shall be unlawful for a person who is driving a motor vehicle on a highway or public vehicular area to consume in the passenger area of that vehicle any malt beverage or unfortified wine. Violation of this subsection shall constitute a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) to five hundred dollars (\$500.00), imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or both."

Sec. 2. G.S. 18B-401 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:
"(a1) Exceptions. - Subsection (a) of this section shall not apply to passengers in a motor home, taxi, for-hire bus, or for-hire limousine."

Sec. 3. This act becomes effective October 1, 1991.
