2	AN ACT TO DIRECT THE ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW COMMISSION TO
3	STUDY THE USE OF POLYSTYRENE FOAM PRODUCTS THAT ARE USED
4	IN CONJUNCTION WITH FOOD FOR HUMAN CONSUMPTION.
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	Section 1. The Environmental Review Commission shall study the use of
7	polystyrene foam products that are used in conjunction with food for human
8	consumption. The study shall include, but is not limited to, the following issues:
9	(1) Current uses of polystyrene foam products in conjunction with food
10	for human consumption.
11	(2) Projected changes in the use of these products.
12	(3) The environmental impacts of these products.
13	(4) The extent to which efforts and programs to reduce the use of, to reuse
14	or recycle, and to redesign or reformulate these products have been
15	effective and are likely to be effective in reducing environmental harm
16	from these products.
17	(5) Whether the use of these products should be restricted or prohibited by
18	the State or whether units of local government should be authorized to
19	restrict or prohibit the use of these products.
20	Sec. 2. The Environmental Review Commission may request any appropriate
21	committee, commission, or State agency to conduct all or any part of the study
22	authorized by this act and to report its findings and recommendations either to the
23	Environmental Review Commission or directly to the General Assembly. If the

committee, commission, or State agency agrees to conduct the study, the committee, 1 commission, or State agency shall do so using funds already appropriated or otherwise 2 3 available to it. Sec. 3. The Environmental Review Commission may report its findings, 4 together with any recommended legislation, to either the 1992 Regular Session of the 5 1991 General Assembly or to the 1993 General Assembly by filing copies of its report 6 with the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of 7 8 Representatives. Sec. 4. This act is effective upon ratification. 9
