2 AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE OPERATOR OF A MOTORBOAT TO OBTAIN AND POSSESS A MOTORBOAT OPERATOR'S LICENSE.

Section 1. G.S. 75A of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read:

# "§ 75A-9.2. Motorboat operator's license.

- (a) No person shall operate a motorboat upon the waters of this State without obtaining a valid motorboat operator's license issued by the Wildlife Resources Commission and having that license on their person or on board the motorboat during operation.
- (b) Persons applying for a motorboat operator's license must be 14 years of age or older and must pass a written examination on boating safety prepared by the Wildlife Resources Commission. The Wildlife Resources Commission shall charge a one-time license fee of ten dollars (\$10.00) for each license issued. The license may be revoked by the Wildlife Resources Commission at any time for cause.
- 17 (c) Persons 14 years of age or older who have, within the preceding five years,
  18 satisfactorily completed a basic boating course given by either the Wildlife Resources
  19 Commission, the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary, or the U.S. Power Squadron, may be
  20 awarded a motorboat operator's license upon presentation of a valid certificate of
  21 completion.
  - (d) The following persons are exempt from the requirements of this section:
    - (1) Persons holding a valid Coast Guard license;
