A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT TO PROVIDE FUNDS TO REIMBURSE LICENSED PRIVATE
2 ADOPTION AGENCIES THAT MAKE HARD-TO-PLACE CHILDREN'S
3 ADOPTIONS POSSIBLE.

5 Whereas, in 1991, there are thousands of prospective adoptive couples in
6 North Carolina and thousands of hard-to-place children, those who are members of
7 minorities, handicapped, or 6 years of age or older, who are living without the benefits
8 of permanent, loving families; and

9 Whereas, when hard-to-place children are placed with permanent, loving
10 families, society as well as the children and their families benefit, not only in terms of
11 institutional costs saved but also in terms of societal gains reaped when these children
12 become productive citizens; and

13 Whereas, many of these prospective adoptive families cannot afford the
14 special costs associated with adopting these special children; and

15 Whereas, the licensed private adoption agencies in North Carolina that make
16 the adoption of so many of these children possible cannot afford to absorb the special
17 costs associated with placing these special children in permanent families, such as
18 counseling, medical, and legal costs; Now, therefore,
19 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

20 Section 1. Effective July 1, 1991, the Department of Human Resources shall
21 reimburse each licensed private adoption agency for costs actually incurred in placing a
22 hard-to-place child, one who is the member of a minority, handicapped, or 6 years of
23 age or older, with a permanent, adoptive family. Costs that may be reimbursed pursuant
24 to this act are administrative, counseling, medical, and legal costs incurred by the

1 agency. The maximum amount to be paid to any one agency in any one fiscal year for
2 placing any one child is \$5,000.

3 Sec. 2. The Social Services Commission shall adopt rules to implement this
4 act, including rules that define hard-to-place children.

5 Sec. 3. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of
6 Human Resources, the sum of \$1,000,000 for the 1991-92 fiscal year and the sum of
7 \$1,000,000 for the 1992-93 fiscal year, to establish a fund to implement this act.

8 Sec. 4. This fund shall become part of the Department of Human Resources'
9 continuation budget and shall be known as the James E. Ezzell, Jr. Memorial Fund.

10 Sec. 5. This act becomes effective July 1, 1991.
