A Class C licensee who is a volunteer 1 member of a municipal or rural fire department may also drive any 2 3 fire-fighting vehicle or combination of fire-fighting vehicles, regardless of GVWR, when necessary in the performance of duty. A 4 5 Class C license does not entitle the licensee to drive a motorcycle. 6 Any unusual vehicle shall be assigned by the Commissioner to the most appropriate class under this subsection or Article 2C with suitable special restrictions if they appear 7 8 to be necessary. 9 Any person who takes up residence in this State on a permanent basis is exempt

Any person who takes up residence in this State on a permanent basis is exempt from the provisions of this subsection for 30 days from the date that residence is established, if he is properly licensed in the jurisdiction of which he is a former resident."

Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification.

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
