2 AN ACT TO DIVIDE JUDICIAL AND PROSECUTORIAL DISTRICTS 11 INTO
3 DISTRICTS 11A AND 11B.

4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

5 Section 1. Effective July 1, 1994, G.S. 7A-41(a) reads as rewritten:

6 "(a) The counties of the State are organized into judicial divisions and superior
7 court districts, and each superior court district has the counties, and the number of
8 regular resident superior court judges set forth in the following table, and for districts of
9 less than a whole county, as set out in subsection (b) of this section:
