1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2 AN ACT APPOINTING PERSONS TO VARIOUS PUBLIC OFFICES UPON THE
3 RECOMMENDATION OF THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF
4 REPRESENTATIVES AND OTHERWISE RELATING TO APPOINTMENTS TO
5 CERTAIN BOARDS.

6 Whereas, G.S. 120-121 authorizes the General Assembly to make certain
7 appointments upon the recommendation of the Speaker of the House of Representatives;
8 and

9 Whereas, the Speaker of the House of Representatives has made
10 recommendations; Now, therefore,
11 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

12 Section 1. W. Ray McLester of Mecklenburg County is appointed to the
13 Alarm Systems Licensing Board for a term to expire on June 30, 1997. This is the
14 categorical appointment for a person licensed under Chapter 74D of the General
15 Statutes.

16 Sec. 2. Morris L. McGough of Buncombe County is appointed to the Board
17 of Directors of the North Carolina Arboretum for a term to expire on June 30, 1998,
18 pursuant to G.S. 116-243.

19 Sec. 3. Judy Ward of Alamance County is appointed to the North Carolina
20 Manufactured Housing Board for a term to expire on June 30, 1997. This is the
21 categorical appointment for a representative of the banking and finance business,
22 pursuant to G.S 143-143.10.

1 Larry T. Gilmore of Guilford County is appointed to the North Carolina
2 Manufactured Housing Board for a term to expire on June 30, 1997. This is the
3 categorical appointment of a representative of the insurance industry, pursuant to G.S.
4 143-143.10.

5 Sec. 4. Jack K. Colby of Guilford County is appointed to the State Building
6 Commission for a term to expire on June 30, 1997. This is the categorical appointment
7 for a manager of a physical plant operation, pursuant to G.S. 143-135.25.

8 Sec. 5. Joanne Byrd and Christopher E. McClure of Wake County are
9 appointed to the Child Day-Care Commission for terms expiring on June 30, 1996.
10 These are the categorical appointments for public members, pursuant to G.S. 143B-
11 168.4.

12 Sec. 6. Rebecca S. Freeman of Durham County is appointed to the North
13 Carolina Board of Dietetics/Nutrition for a term to expire on June 30, 1997. This is the
14 categorical appointment for a professional whose primary practice is community or
15 public health dietetics/nutrition, pursuant to G.S. 90-354.

16 Sec. 7. Cathy Chapman of Forsyth County is appointed to the North Carolina
17 Center for Nursing Board of Directors for a term to expire on June 30, 1997. This is the
18 categorical appointment for a nurse, pursuant to G.S. 90-171.71.

19 Sec. 8. Roy A. Stevens of Carteret County is appointed to the North Carolina
20 State Ports Authority for a term to expire on June 30, 1996, pursuant to G.S. 143B-452.

21 Sec. 9. Mack Donaldson of Guilford County is appointed to the Private
22 Protective Services Board for a term to expire on June 30, 1997. This is the categorical
23 appointment for a person licensed under Chapter 74C of the General Statutes.

24 Sec. 10. Jennie Hayman and Marvealave D. Francis of Wake County are
25 appointed to the Rules Review Commission for terms expiring on June 30, 1996,
26 pursuant to G.S. 143B-30.1.

27 Sec. 11. Ronald L. Smith of Carteret County and Thomas K. Jenkins of
28 Macon County are appointed to the North Carolina Travel and Tourism Board for terms
29 to begin on January 1, 1995, and expire on December 31, 1996. These are the
30 categorical appointments for members of the House of Representatives, pursuant to G.S.
31 143B-434.1.

32 Sue Wilmoth of Watauga County is appointed to the North Carolina Travel
33 and Tourism Board for a term to begin on January 1, 1995, and expire on December 31,
34 1996. This is the categorical appointment of a public member interested in matters
35 relating to travel and tourism, pursuant to G.S. 143B-434.1.

36 Carmen Crockett of Wake County is appointed to the North Carolina Travel
37 and Tourism Board for a term to begin on January 1, 1995, and expire on December 31,
38 1996. This is the categorical appointment of a person associated with tourism
39 attractions in North Carolina, pursuant to G.S. 143B-434.1.

40 Sec. 12. Benton F. "Sonny" Clifton, Jr., of Wake County is appointed to the
41 Board of Trustees of the Teachers' and State Employees' Comprehensive Major Medical
42 Plan for a term to expire on June 30, 1996, pursuant to G.S. 135-39.

43 Sec. 13. Ches Gwin of Mecklenburg County is appointed to the North
44 Carolina Medical Database Commission for a term to expire on June 30, 1996. This is

1 the categorical appointment for a person who is a representative of an employer of 200
2 or more employees in a business that is unrelated to a health care provider or third-party
3 payor, pursuant to G.S. 131E-211.

4 Dr. James P. Green, Sr., of Vance County is appointed to the North Carolina
5 Medical Database Commission for a term to expire on June 30, 1996. This is the
6 categorical appointment for a physician, pursuant to G.S. 131E-211.

7 O. Louis Gentry of Guilford County is appointed to the North Carolina
8 Medical Database Commission for a term to expire on June 30, 1996. This is the
9 categorical appointment for a representative of a commercial insurance company
10 providing health insurance in North Carolina, pursuant to G.S. 131E-211.

11 Sec. 14. Dewey Brown of Wake County is appointed to the North Carolina
12 Housing Partnership for a term to begin on September 1, 1994, and expire on August
13 31, 1996. This is the categorical appointment for a representative of a nonprofit housing
14 development corporation, pursuant to G.S. 122E-4(b).

15 Reverend William D. Crowder of Wake County is appointed to the North
16 Carolina Housing Partnership for a term to begin on September 1, 1994, and expire on
17 August 31, 1996. This is the categorical appointment for a resident of low-income
18 housing, pursuant to G.S. 122E-4(b).

19 Kenneth Freeman of Robeson County is appointed to the North Carolina
20 Housing Partnership for a term to begin on September 1, 1994, and expire on August
21 31, 1996. This is the categorical appointment for a representative of a real estate
22 lending industry, pursuant to G.S. 122E-4(b).

23 Abdul Rasheed of Vance County and Michael D. Calhoun of Durham County
24 are appointed to the North Carolina Housing Partnership for terms beginning on
25 September 1, 1994, and expiring on August 31, 1996. These are the categorical
26 appointments for at-large members, pursuant to G.S. 122E-4(b).

27 Sec. 15. James E. Norris of Columbus County is appointed to the
28 Southeastern North Carolina Farmers' Market Commission for a term to expire on June
29 30, 1996, pursuant to G.S. 106-727.

30 Sec. 16. James B. Black, Jr., of Mecklenburg County is appointed to the
31 North Carolina Wildlife Resources Commission for a term to expire on April 24, 1995,
32 pursuant to G.S. 113-241.

33 Sec. 17. William A. Creech of Wake County and Daryl Garner of Carteret
34 County are appointed to the Capitol Preservation Commission for terms expiring on
35 June 30, 1996, pursuant to G.S. 143B-80.9.

36 Phillip Freelon of Wake County is appointed to the Capitol Preservation
37 Commission for a term to expire on June 30, 1998. This is the categorical appointment
38 for a person with experience or background in the restoration of monumental buildings,
39 historic restoration, or fine arts conservation, pursuant to G.S. 143B-80.9.

40 Sec. 18. Members of the Commission for a Competitive North Carolina, who
41 are also members of the General Assembly, shall be reimbursed for subsistence and
42 travel expenses at the rates set forth in G.S. 120-3.1 for the General Assembly members.

43 Sec. 19. Section 19 of Chapter 500 of the 1993 Session Laws reads as
44 rewritten:

1 "Sec. 19. This act becomes effective October 1, 1993, provided that Section 3 of
2 this act does not affect the term of office of any member serving on that ~~date~~-date, and
3 that the total membership of the North Carolina Veterinary Medical Board, as set forth
4 in Section 3, is temporarily increased to eight during the remainder of the term of office
5 of the member appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives."

6 Sec. 20. This act is effective upon ratification.
