A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 AN ACT TO TRANSFER THE NORTH CAROLINA STATE MUSEUM OF 3 NATURAL SCIENCES AND ITS ADVISORY COMMISSION FROM THE 4 DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE TO THE DEPARTMENT OF CULTURAL **RESOURCES AND TO CONFORM VARIOUS STATUTORY REFERENCES TO** 5 THAT MUSEUM. 6 7 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: Section 1. The statutory authority, powers, duties, and functions, records, 8 9 personnel, property, and unexpended balances of appropriations, allocations, or other funds of (i) the North Carolina State Museum of Natural Sciences, and of (ii) the 10 Advisory Commission established in Article 40 of Chapter 143 of the General Statutes 11 for the North Carolina State Museum of Natural Sciences, are transferred from the 12 Department of Agriculture to the Department of Cultural Resources. This transfer has 13 all of the elements of a Type I transfer as defined by G.S. 143-6. 14 Sec. 2. Article 40 of Chapter 143 of the General Statutes, G.S. 143-370 15 through G.S. 143-373 is recodified as Article 5 of Chapter 121 of the General Statutes, 16 G.S. 121-45 through G.S. 121-48. 17 18 Sec. 3. G.S. 143A-66 is repealed. 19 Sec. 4. G.S. 106-22(15) is repealed. Sec. 5. G.S. 121-4 is amended by adding a new subdivision to read: 20 21 "(17) To keep a museum or collection of the cultural and other resources and the natural history of the State." 22 Sec. 6. Article 5 of Chapter 121 of the General Statutes as recodified in 23
- 24 Section 2 of this act reads as rewritten:

"ARTICLE 5.

"ADVISORY COMMISSION FOR STATE MUSEUM OF NATURAL HISTORY.

NORTH CAROLINA STATE MUSEUM OF NATURAL SCIENCES.

5 "§ 121-45. Commission created; membership.

6 There is hereby-created an Advisory Commission for the Museum of Natural History 7 North Carolina State Museum of Natural Sciences which shall determine its own 8 organization. It shall consist of at least nine members, which shall include the Director of the Museum of Natural History, North Carolina State Museum of Natural Sciences, the 9 10 Commissioner of Agriculture, the Secretary of Cultural Resources, the State Geologist and Secretary of Environment, Health, and Natural Resources, the Director of the Institute 11 12 of Fisheries Research of the University of North Carolina, the Director of the Wildlife 13 Resources Commission, the Superintendent of Public Instruction, or qualified representative of any or all of the above-named members, and at least three persons 14 15 representing the East, the Piedmont, [and]-and the Western areas of the State. Members 16 appointed by the Governor shall serve for terms of two years with the first appointments 17 to be made effective September 1, 1961. Any member may be removed by the 18 Governor for cause.

19 "§ 121-46. Duties of Commission; meetings, formulation of policies and 20 recommendations to Governor and General Assembly.

21 It shall be the duty of the Advisory Commission for the Museum of Natural History 22 North Carolina State Museum of Natural Sciences to meet at least twice each year, to formulate policies for the advancement of the said-Museum, to make recommendations 23 24 to the Governor and to the General Assembly concerning the Museum, and to assist in 25 promoting and developing wider and more effective use of the Museum of Natural History North Carolina State Museum of Natural Sciences as an educational, scientific and 26 27 historical exhibit.

28 "§ 121-47. No compensation of members; reimbursement for expenses.

29 Members of the Advisory Commission shall serve without compensation and shall 30 be reimbursed for actual expenses incurred while in attendance at meetings of the 31 Commission at the same rate as that established for reimbursement of State employees. Payment for such reimbursement for actual expense shall be made from the 32 Contingency and Emergency Fund. 33

34 "§ 121-48. Reports to General Assembly.

The Commission shall prepare and submit to the 1963-1995 General Assembly, and 35 to each succeeding General Assembly, a report outlining the needs of the State Museum 36 of Natural History, North Carolina State Museum of Natural Sciences and their 37 38 recommendation for improvement of the effectiveness of the said State Museum of 39 Natural History North Carolina State Museum of Natural Sciences for the purpose hereinabove set forth." 40 41

Sec. 7. G.S. 14-419 reads as rewritten:

42 "§ 14-419. Investigation of suspected violations; seizure and examination of reptiles; disposition of reptiles. 43

In any case in which any law-enforcement officer or animal control officer has 1 2 reasonable grounds to believe that any of the provisions of this Article have been or are 3 about to be violated, it shall be the duty of such officer and he is hereby authorized, 4 empowered, and directed to immediately investigate such violation or impending violation and to forthwith seize the reptile or reptiles involved, and all such officers are 5 6 hereby authorized and directed to deliver such reptiles to the Museum of Natural History 7 North Carolina State Museum of Natural Sciences or to its designated representative for 8 examination and test for the purpose of ascertaining whether said reptiles contain venom 9 and are poisonous. If the Museum of Natural History-North Carolina State Museum of 10 Natural Sciences or its designated representative finds that said reptiles are dangerously poisonous, the Museum of Natural History-North Carolina State Museum of Natural 11 12 Sciences or its designated representative shall be empowered to dispose of said reptiles 13 in a manner consistent with the safety of the public; but if said-the Museum or its 14 designated representative find that the reptiles are not dangerously poisonous, and are 15 not and cannot be harmful to human life, safety, health or welfare, then it shall be the 16 duty of such officers to return the said reptiles to the person from whom they were 17 seized within five days."

Sec. 8. G.S. 14-420 reads as rewritten:

19 "§ 14-420. Arrest of persons violating provisions of Article.

If the examination and tests made by the <u>Museum of Natural History-North Carolina</u> <u>State Museum of Natural Sciences</u> or its designated representative as provided herein show that such reptiles are dangerously poisonous, it shall be the duty of the officers making the seizure, in addition to destroying such reptiles, also to arrest all persons violating any of the provisions of this Article."

Sec. 9. G.S. 106-202.17(b) reads as rewritten:

26 The Scientific Committee shall consist of the Directors of The University of "(b) 27 North Carolina at Chapel Hill Herbarium, the North Carolina State University 28 Herbarium, the North Carolina Botanical Garden of The University of North Carolina at 29 Chapel Hill, the North Carolina Museum of Natural History-North Carolina State Museum 30 of Natural Sciences and the North Carolina Natural Heritage Program of the Department 31 of Environment, Health, and Natural Resources or their designees, a representative of the North Carolina Association of Nurserymen, Inc., appointed by the Commissioner, 32 and a representative of the Garden Club of North Carolina, Incorporated, the North 33 34 Carolina Chapter of the Nature Conservancy or the North Carolina Wild Flower 35 Preservation Society, Inc., appointed by the Commissioner. Members shall serve for 36 three-year terms and may succeed themselves."

Sec. 10. G.S. 147-50 reads as rewritten:

38 "§ 147-50. Publications of State officials and department heads furnished to certain 39 institutions, agencies, etc.

Every State official and every head of a State department, institution or agency
issuing any printed report, bulletin, map, or other publication shall, on request, furnish
