1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO GIVE RECIPIENTS OF PROSPECTIVE TEACHER SCHOLARSHIP LOANS CREDIT AGAINST THE LOAN AMOUNT FOR WORKING PART TIME AS TEACHERS.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

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Section 1. G.S. 115C-471(5) reads as rewritten:

For each full-one-half school year taught in a North Carolina public "(5)school, the recipient of a scholarship loan shall receive credit upon the amount due by reason of such-the loan equal to all interest accrued upon the loan to that time plus a credit of two-one thousand dollars (\$2,000) (\$1,000) upon the principal amount of such the obligation or such the lesser amount as may remain due upon said principal; that remains due upon the principal. For up to two full school years taught in a North Carolina public school as a part-time teacher who is working at least one-half time, the recipient of a scholarship loan shall receive credit for each year upon the amount due by reason of the loan equal to all interest accrued upon the loan to that time plus a credit of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) upon the principal amount of the obligation or the lesser amount that remains due upon the principal. provided, however, that in In lieu of teaching in the public school, a recipient may elect to pay in cash the full amount of scholarship loans received plus interest then due thereon or any part thereof which has not been canceled by the State Board of Education by reason of teaching service rendered.

3	schools instead of repaying the loans to ensure that they are properly
1	fulfilling their obligations to teach in the public schools."
