1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2 AN ACT CONCERNING ELECTION OF THE NEW HANOVER COUNTY BOARD
3 OF EDUCATION.

4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

5 Section 1. The manner of election of the New Hanover County Board of
6 Education is changed to one of the following methods:

7 (1) Number of members of the board of education: The board may consist
8 of any number of members not less than three.

9 (2) Terms of office of members of the board of education:

10 a. Members shall be elected for two-year terms of office.

11 b. Members shall be elected for four-year terms of office.

12 c. Members shall be elected for overlapping four-year terms of
13 office.

14 (3) Mode of election of the board of education:

15 a. The qualified voters of the entire county shall nominate all
16 candidates for and elect all members of the board.

17 For options b., c., and d., the county is divided into electoral districts,
18 and board members shall be apportioned to the districts so that the
19 quotients obtained by dividing the population of each district by the
20 number of members apportioned to the district complies with
21 constitutional provisions.

22 b. The qualified voters of each district shall nominate candidates
23 and elect members who reside in the district for seats
24 apportioned to that district; and the qualified voters of the entire

1 county shall nominate candidates and elect members
2 apportioned to the county at large, if any.

3 c. The qualified voters of each district shall nominate candidates
4 who reside in the district for seats apportioned to that district,
5 and the qualified voters of the entire county shall nominate
6 candidates for seats apportioned to the county at large, if any;
7 and the qualified voters of the entire county shall elect all the
8 members of the board.

9 d. Members shall reside in and represent the districts according to
10 the apportionment plan adopted, but the qualified voters of the
11 entire county shall nominate all candidates for and elect all
12 members of the board.

13 The county is divided into the requisite number of electoral districts
14 according to the apportionment plan adopted.

15 Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification.
