2	AN ACT TO CREATE THE NORTH CAROLINA PROFESSIONAL TEACHING		
3	STANDARDS COMMISSION.		
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
5	Section 1. Article 20 of Chapter 115C of the General Statutes is amended by		
6	adding a new section to read:		
7	" <u>§ 115C-295.1. North Carolina Professional Teaching Standards Commission.</u>		
8	(a) There is created the North Carolina Professional Teaching Standards		
9	Commission (the 'Commission'). The Commission shall be located administratively		
10	within the Department of Public Instruction but shall exercise its powers and duties		
11	independently of the Department of Public Instruction. The Department of Public		
12	Instruction shall provide staff, offices, office equipment, and meeting space to the		
13	Commission.		
14	(b) The purpose of the Commission is to establish high standards for North		
15	Carolina teachers and the teaching profession.		
16	(c) <u>The Commission shall consist of the following 18 members:</u>		
17	(1) The State Superintendent of Public Instruction who shall serve as chair		
18	of the Commission.		
19	(2) <u>A representative of the North Carolina Association of Educators</u>		
20	appointed by the Governor.

1	<u>(3)</u>	A representative of the North Carolina Federation of Teachers			
2		appointed by the Governor.			
3	<u>(4)</u>	Three teachers, at least one of whom teaches in elementary school and			
4		one of whom teaches special education, appointed by the Governor.			
5	<u>(5)</u>	Two teachers, at least one of whom teaches in middle or junior high			
6		school, appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate.			
7	<u>(6)</u>	Two teachers, at least one of whom teaches in high school, appointed			
8		by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.			
9	<u>(7)</u>	One school administrator, either a principal or a superintendent,			
10		appointed by the Governor.			
11	<u>(8)</u>	Two representatives of teacher education institutions, one of whom			
12		shall be a representative of a University of North Carolina institution			
13		and one of whom shall be a representative of a private teacher			
14		education institution, appointed by the Governor.			
15	<u>(9)</u>	One State Board member appointed by the chair of the State Board of			
16		Education.			
17	<u>(10)</u>	Two at-large members appointed by the Governor.			
18	<u>(11)</u>	Two at-large members, one of these members shall be appointed by			
19		the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and one of these members			
20		shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.			
21	In making	appointments, the appointing authorities are encouraged to select			
22	qualified citizens who are committed to improving the teaching profession and student				
23	achievement and who represent the racial, geographic, and gender diversity of the State.				
24	The members shall serve for two-year terms. Initial terms shall begin September 1,				
25	1994. Vacancies in the membership shall be filled by the original appointing authority				
26	using the same criteria as provided in this subsection.				
27	(d) <u>The Commission shall elect a vice-chair from among its membership</u> . In the				
28	absence of the chair, the vice-chair shall preside over the Commission's meetings.				
29	(e) Meetings of the the Commission shall be held upon the call of the chair or the				
30	vice-chair with the approval of the chair.				
31	(f) Members of the Commission who are State or public school employees shall				
32	receive travel expenses as set forth in G.S. 138-6. All other Commission members shall				
33	receive per diem and travel expenses as set forth in G.S. 138-5."				
34	Sec. 2. (a)	The Commission shall prepare a plan for how it could establish			
35		for teachers and the teaching profession. In preparing the plan the			
36	Commission shall consider: (i) constitutional and statutory issues concerning the role of				
37	the Commission and its relationship to the State Board of Education; (ii) the model for a				
38	professional educator standards board under Article 19A of Chapter 115C of the				
39	General Statutes, Standards Board for Public School Administrators; and (iii) models				
40	for professional educator standards boards from other states. In developing the plan the

23	•	mittee, and the State Board of Education.
