TEACHER ASS'T LEAVE FLEXIBILITY. Intro. 3/29. Senate amendment adds new section providing in GS 115C-302(a)(1) that vacation leave for instructional personnel who do not require a substitute may not be restricted to days that students are not in school. Changes effective date from July 1 to Aug. 1, 1993 and makes technical change.
