AN ACT TO PROHIBIT THE TEACHING OR DISCUSSION IN ANY CLASS OF ANY INFORMATION RELATED TO SEXUAL PRACTICES THAT ARE NOT LAWFUL IN NORTH CAROLINA.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. G.S. 115C-81(c) reads as rewritten:

"(c) Local boards of education shall provide for the efficient teaching at appropriate grade levels of all materials set forth in the standard course of study, including integrated instruction in the areas of citizenship in the United States of America, government of the State of North Carolina, government of the United States, fire prevention, the free enterprise system, the dangers of harmful or illegal drugs, including alcohol, and cardio-pulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and the Heimlich maneuver.

Local boards of education shall not permit the teaching or discussion in any class of any information related to sexual practices that are not lawful in North Carolina.

Local boards of education shall require all teachers and principals to conduct classes except foreign language classes in English. Any teacher or principal who refuses to do so may be dismissed."

Sec. 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 1994, and applies to all school years beginning with the 1994-95 school year.
