Such a policy shall provide that the teacher in charge of the 1 2 room in which each class is held may shall announce that a 3 period of silence not to exceed one minute in duration shall be 4 observed and that during that period silence shall be 5 maintained and no one may engage in any other activities. 6 Such period of silence shall be totally and completely 7 unstructured and free of guidance or influence of any kind 8 from any sources." 9 Sec. 2. G.S. 115C-47 is amended by adding a new subdivision to read: 10 "(29a) To Ensure Freedom of Religion. - No local board of education shall have a policy of denying, or that effectively 11 12 prevents participation in, prayer in public schools by individuals on a voluntary basis. No local board of education 13 14

prevents participation in, prayer in public schools by individuals on a voluntary basis. No local board of education shall require any person to participate in prayer or influence the form or content of any prayer in public schools. This subdivision shall not be construed to direct any local board of education to take any action in violation of the Constitutions of North Carolina or the United States."

Sec. 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 1995, and applies to all school years beginning with the 1995-96 school year.
