13	(b)	Decreases in Federal Fund Availability
14		If federal funds are reduced below the amounts specified above after the
15	offective	date of this act then every program except for the Indian Affairs Programs in

effective date of this act, then every program, except for the Indian Affairs Programs in
the Low Income Energy Block Grant, in each of the federal block grants listed above,
shall be reduced equally to total the reduction in federal funds.

(c) Increases in Federal Fund Availability

Any block grant funds appropriated by the United States Congress in addition to the funds specified in this act shall be expended by the Department of Human Resources, with the approval of the Office of State Budget and Management, provided the resultant increases are in accordance with federal block grant requirements and are within the scope of the block grant plan approved by the General Assembly. All these budgeted increases shall be reported to the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations and to the Director of the Fiscal Research Division.

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This subsection shall not apply to Job Training Partnership Act funds.

(d) If funds appropriated through the Child Care and Development Block Grant for
any program cannot be obligated or spent in that program within the obligation or
liquidation periods allowed by the federal grants, the Department may move funds to
other programs, in accordance with the federal requirements of the grant, in order to use
the federal funds fully.

(e) Supplemental Head Start funds appropriated in this section to the
 Department of Human Resources shall continue to be allocated to those counties
 currently receiving these funds.

If federal block grant funds are reduced or increased by 30 the Congress of the United States after the effective date of this act, then these reductions 31 32 or increases shall be allocated in accordance with subsection (d) or (e) of this section, as 33 applicable. 34

Sec. 2.
