May 30, 1996 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO AMEND THE NURSING HOME ADVISORY COMMITTEE LAW AND THE OMBUDSMAN LAW AS IT AFFECTS NEW HANOVER COUNTY. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: Section 1. G.S. 131E-128(b) reads as rewritten: A community advisory committee shall be established in each "(b) county which has a nursing home, including a nursing home operated by a hospital licensed under Article 5 of G.S. Chapter 131E, shall serve all the homes in the county, and shall work with each home in the best interest of the persons residing in each home. In a county which has one, two, or three nursing homes, the committee shall have a minimum of five members. In a county with four or more nursing homes, the committee shall have a minimum of one additional member for each nursing home in excess of three. In each county with four or more nursing homes, the committee shall (2) establish a subcommittee of no more than five members and no fewer

than three members from the committee for each nursing home in the
