2	AN ACT TO CLARIFY THE PURPOSE FOR A MOMENT OF SILENCE IN THE
3	PUBLIC SCHOOLS AND TO PROHIBIT LOCAL BOARDS OF EDUCATION
4	FROM ADOPTING POLICIES THAT DENY CERTAIN FIRST AMENDMENT
5	RIGHTS.
6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
7	Section 1. G.S. 115C-47(29) reads as rewritten:
8	" (29) To Authorize the Observance of a Moment of Silence.
9	<ul> <li>Local boards of education may—To afford students and teachers</li> </ul>
10	a moment of quiet reflection at the beginning of each day in the
11	public schools, to create a boundary between school time and
12	nonschool time, and to set a tone of decorum in the classroom
13	that will be conducive to discipline and learning, each local
14	board of education may adopt policies a policy to authorize the
15	observance of a moment of silence at the commencement of
16	the first class of each day in all grades in the public schools.
17	Such a policy shall provide that the teacher in charge of the
18	room in which each class is held may announce that a period of
19	silence not to exceed one minute in duration shall be observed

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1	and that during that period silence shall be maintained and no
2	one may engage in any other activities. Such period of silence
3	shall be totally and completely unstructured and free of
4	guidance or influence of any kind from any sources."
5	Sec. 2. G.S. 115C-47 is amended by adding a new subdivision to read:
6	" (29a) To Ensure Freedom of Religion No local board of
7	education shall have a policy of denying, or that effectively
8	prevents participation in, prayer in public schools by
9	individuals on a voluntary basis, except when necessary to
10	maintain order and discipline. No local board of education
11	shall encourage or require any person to participate in prayer or
12	influence the form or content of any prayer in public schools.
13	This subdivision shall not be construed to direct any local
14	board of education to take any action in violation of the
15	Constitutions of North Carolina or the United States."
16	Sec. 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 1995, and applies to all school years
17	beginning with the 1995-96 school year.
