4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:	
5	Section 1. 7	The funds appropriated for the 1994-95 fiscal year to the Office of
6	State Budget and Management, School Technology Reserve are transferred to the State	
7	Board of Education, St	ate School Technology Fund and shall be spent as follows:
8	(1) The $s$	sum of forty-one million four hundred fifty thousand dollars
9	(\$41,4	450,000) shall be allocated by the State Board of Education to the
10	credit	of local school administrative units as follows:
11	a.	Ten percent (10%) of these funds shall be allocated in
12		accordance with the low-wealth county supplemental school
13		funding formula set out in Section 138 of Chapter 321 of the
14		1993 Session Laws, as rewritten by Section 19.32 of Chapter 769
15		of the 1993 Session Laws; and
16	b.	Ninety percent (90%) of these funds shall be allocated on the
17		basis of average daily membership: Provided, however, the State
18		Board shall use part of these funds, as necessary, to ensure that
19		the total allocation to a local school administrative unit that

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qualifies for low-wealth county supplemental school funding is at least fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000).

Before a local school technology plan is approved by the State Board of Education, a local board of education may use up to ten percent (10%) of the funds credited to it in the Fund to develop its local school technology plan or, to the extent that these funds are not needed to develop the local school technology plan, for staff development to improve the use of instructional technology. After a local school technology plan is reviewed by the Department of Public Instruction and the Information Resources Management Commission and approved by the State Board of Education, a local board of education may use the remainder of these funds for nonpersonnel expenses to implement its local school technology plan, including staff development, hardware, software, networks, maintenance contracts, and school facility modifications necessary for the installation of equipment.

Two or more local school administrative units may jointly expend funds to develop their individual local school technology plans, for staff development, or to implement their individual local school technology plans.

- (2) The sum of four hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$450,000) shall be used by the School Technology Commission to develop and provide to each local school administrative unit computer software for school technology planning assistance.
- (3) The sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) shall be used by the School Technology Commission for the research and development of staff training models in local school administrative units throughout the State. The research and development of the models shall be performed by collaborative efforts of local school administrative units with institutions of higher education or other appropriate entities.
  - Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification.
