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1	"(14) Brew on Premises Permit. – A permit may be issued to a business,
2	located in a jurisdiction where the sale of malt beverages is allowed,
3	where individual customers who are 21 years old or older may
4	purchase ingredients and rent the equipment, time, and space to brew
5	malt beverages for personal use in amounts set forth in 27 C.F.R. §
6	25.205. The customer must do all of the following:
7	<u>a.</u> <u>Select a recipe and kettle.</u>
8	b. Weigh out the proper ingredients and add them to the kettle.
9	 b. Weigh out the proper ingredients and add them to the kettle. c. Transfer the wort to the fermenter. d. Add the yeast. e. Place the ingredients in a fermentation room. f. Filter, carbonate, and bottle the malt beverage.
10	d. Add the yeast.
11	e. <u>Place the ingredients in a fermentation room.</u>
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13	A permittee may transfer the ingredients from the fermentation room to
14	the cold room and may assist the customer in all the steps involved in
15	brewing a malt beverage except adding the yeast. A malt beverage
16	produced under this subdivision may not contain more than six percent
17	(6%) alcohol by volume."
18	Section 4. G.S. 18B-904 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:
19	"(g) <u>Regulations issued by the Commission interpreting G.S. 18B-1000(8) shall not</u>
20	apply to any sports club that was issued any permits prior to July 1, 1997, and that is
21	located in any county that borders on: (i) the largest county in the State, (ii) another state,
22	and (iii) a county where 10 or more municipal ABC systems and a county-wide ABC
23	system have been approved."
24	Section 5. This act is effective when it becomes law.
