2 AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR ADDITIONAL REGULATION OF PERSONAL WATERCRAFT.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. G.S. 75A-13.2 reads as rewritten:

"§ 75A-13.2. Personal watercraft.

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- (a) No person shall operate a personal watercraft on the waters of this State at any time between the hours from one hour after sunset to one hour before and sunrise. For purposes of this section, 'personal watercraft' means a small vessel which uses an outboard motor, or an inboard motor powering a water jet pump, as its primary source of motive power and which is designed to be operated by a person sitting, standing, or kneeling on, or being towed behind the vessel, rather than in the conventional manner of sitting or standing inside the vehicle.
- (a1) No person under 16 years of age shall operate a personal watercraft on the waters of this State, nor shall a person knowingly allow a person under the age of 16 to operate a personal watercraft.
- (b) No person shall operate a personal watercraft unless on the waters of this State unless:
