A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO PROHIBIT THE RECKLESS USE OF A FIREARM OR BOW AND ARROW AND TO REGULATE HUNTING FROM THE RIGHT-OF-WAY IN WASHINGTON COUNTY.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. It is unlawful to hunt, take, or kill, or to attempt to hunt, take, or kill, any wild animal or wild bird with firearm, bow and arrow, or crossbow, on, from, or across the right-of-way of any State-maintained road or highway, or to discharge any firearm, bow and arrow, or crossbow on, from, or across the right-of-way of any State-maintained road or highway. A hunter recovering dogs shall not be in violation of this section so long as all the hunter's weapons remain in a motor vehicle.

Section 2. It is unlawful to possess a loaded shotgun or center-fire rifle while on the right-of-way of any State-maintained road or highway outside the confines of the passenger area of a vehicle. This section does not apply to the owner in fee or the lessee of the land adjacent to either side of the right-of-way at the point where the person is on the right-of-way.

Section 3. This act does not apply to:

- (1) The use or possession of firearms in defense of persons or property;
- (2) Persons lawfully possessing a firearm under a permit issued pursuant to Article 54B of Chapter 14 of the General Statutes;

12	Resources Commission, by sheriffs and deputy sheriffs, and by other peace officers with	
13	general subject matter jurisdiction.	
14	Section	on 6. This act shall apply to Washington County only.
15	Section	on 7. This act becomes effective December 1, 1997.
