- Selected significant pupil assignment plans, including successful (4) alternatives, in other states affected by court-ordered plans;
- The fiscal implications, including transportation, operation, facilities, (5) and tuition costs, of pupil assignment options; and

ļ	Section 2. The Legislative Research Commission, if it authorizes a committee
5	to conduct this study, shall appoint at least four public members to that committee.

7	may report its findings and recommendations to the 1999 General Assembly.
