2	AN ACT PERTAINING TO THE SANITIZATION OF COOKING UTENSILS
3	PROVIDED BY LODGING ESTABLISHMENTS, AS RECOMMENDED BY THE
4	JOINT LEGISLATIVE ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURE OVERSIGHT
5	COMMITTEE.
6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
7	Section 1. G.S. 130A-248(a3) reads as rewritten:
8	"(a3) The rules adopted by the Commission pursuant to subsections (a), (a1), and
9	(a2) of this section shall address, but not be limited to, the following:
10	(1) Sanitation requirements for cleanliness of floors, walls, ceilings, storage
11	spaces, utensils, ventilation equipment, and other areas and items;
12	(2) Requirements for:
13	a. Lighting and water supply;
14	b. Wastewater collection, treatment, and disposal facilities; and
15	c. Lavatory and toilet facilities, food protection, and waste disposal;
16	(3) The cleaning and bactericidal treatment of eating and drinking utensils
17	and other food-contact surfaces; surfaces. A requirement imposed under
18	this subdivision to sanitize eating and drinking utensils and other food-

1		contact surfaces does not apply to utensils and surfaces in a lodging unit
2		that provides reusable utensils for guests to prepare food while staying
3		in the lodging unit.
4	(3a)	The appropriate and reasonable use of gloves or utensils by employees
5	()	who handle unwrapped food;
6	(4)	The methods of food preparation, transportation, catering, storage, and
7		serving;
8	(5)	The health of employees;
9	(6)	Animal and vermin control; and
10	(7)	The prohibition against the offering of unwrapped food samples to the
11		general public unless the offering and acceptance of the samples are
12		continuously supervised by an agent of the entity preparing or offering
13		the samples or by an agent of the entity on whose premises the samples
14		are made available. As used in this subdivision, 'food samples' means
15		unwrapped food prepared and made available for sampling by and
16		without charge to the general public for the purpose of promoting the
17		food made available for sampling. This subdivision does not apply to
18		unwrapped food prepared and offered in buffet, cafeteria, or other style
19		in exchange for payment by the general public or by the person or entity
20		arranging for the preparation and offering of such unwrapped food. This
21		subdivision shall not apply to open air produce markets nor to farmer
22		market facilities operated on land owned or leased by the State of North
23		Carolina or any local government.
24	The rules shall	contain a system for grading establishments, such as Grade A, Grade B,
25		he rules shall be written in a manner that promotes consistency in both the

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interpretation and application of the grading system." Section 2. This act is effective when it becomes law. 27
