**EFFECTIVE DATE**: Sections 1 through 5, 7, and 8 of this act become effective October 1, 1998. Sections 6 and 9 of this act become effective October 1, 1999. Section 10 of this act becomes effective July 1, 1998. The remainder of this act is effective upon passage.

## **BILL SUMMARY:**

Amends GS 147-54.11 through 147-54.20 to expand role of Business License Information Office within Secretary of State's office to provide the public with information regarding laws and regulations regarding business activities as well as providing information on business licensing matters, and to refer persons seeking information to particular individuals in appropriate agencies to obtain requested information. Requires this office to work with small business community to identify problems in state government related to unnecessary delays, inconsistencies between regulatory agencies, and inefficient and ineffective use of state resources, and to implement automated system to track number of inquiries received each year and resolution of inquiry. Applicant's identity, upon request, is confidential. Requires Secretary of State to report to Joint Legislation Commission on Government Operations by November 1 of each year on most common and egregious problems public has had in communicating with and obtaining information from state agencies during previous year and to make any recommendations for legislative changes.

## **ASSUMPTIONS AND METHODOLOGY:**

The Secretary of State reports a need for two additional positions, including equipment and supplies to carry out the additional duties described in the bill. The following table sets out the positions and associated costs:
