11		a.	The officer has in his possession a warrant or order or a copy of

16			verifies with the agency that the warrant is current and valid; or

1	b. The officer has reasonable cause to believe the person to be
2	arrested is present, and
3	c. The officer has given, or made reasonable effort to give, notice of
4	his authority and purpose to an occupant thereof, unless there is
5	reasonable cause to believe that the giving of such notice would
6	present a clear danger to human life.
7	(2) The law-enforcement officer may use force to enter the premises or
8	vehicle if he reasonably believes that admittance is being denied or
9	unreasonably delayed, or if he is authorized under subsection (e)(1)c to
10	enter without giving notice of his authority and purpose."
11	Section 2. This act becomes effective October 1, 1999.
