10	Section 1. Article 34 of Chapter 106 of the General Statutes is amended by

6	" <u>§ 106-363.6. Fee on rabies vaccination.</u>
7	(a) Fee. – A fee of fifty cents $(50\phi)$ is payable by the owner of a dog or cat
8	when the dog or cat receives a rabies vaccination. The fee is payable to the licensed
9	veterinarian or certified rabies vaccinator that administers the rabies vaccination. The
10	licensed veterinarian or certified rabies vaccinator must submit the fees collected under
11	this subsection to the Animal Welfare Section of the Department of Agriculture and
12	Consumer Services within 30 days after the end of each calendar quarter. The
13	Department shall credit these payments to the Spay/Neuter Fund established in G.S. 106-
14	<u>363.5.</u>
15	(b) Exception. – The fee in subsection (a) of this section does not apply to rabies
16	vaccinations administered at a countywide rabies vaccination clinic where the fee
17	charged for the rabies vaccination is set by the county board of commissioners under G.S.
18	<u>130A-188.</u>
19	" <u>§ 106-363.7. Report by Veterinary Public Health Director.</u>
20	The Veterinary Public Health Director in the Department of Health and Human
21	Services shall report to the Director of the Animal Welfare Section of the Department of
22	Agriculture and Consumer Services on the number of rabies vaccination tags sold to
23	licensed veterinarians and certified rabies vaccinators."
24	Section 2. This act becomes effective January 1, 1999, and applies to rabies

25 vaccinations administered on or after that date.
