1 "<u>§ 53-299. Application.</u>

Notwithstanding any other law, this Article shall apply to all contracts, securities, and
instruments, including contracts with respect to commercial transactions.

4 "<u>§ 53-300. No application to other currency alteration.</u>

5 In circumstances of currency alteration other than the introduction of the euro, this 6 Article shall not be interpreted as creating any negative inference or negative 7 presumption regarding the validity or enforceability of contracts, securities, or 8 instruments denominated in whole or in part in a currency affected by that alteration."

9 Section 2. This act is effective when it becomes law and applies to contracts 10 entered into or issued before, on, or after the effective date.
