2	AN ACT TO PROVIDE INCENTIVES FOR DEVELOPMENT OF THE FILM
3	INDUSTRY IN NORTH CAROLINA.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	Section 1. Part 2 of Article 10 of Chapter 143B of the General Statutes is
6	amended by adding a new section to read:
7	" <u>§ 143B-434.3. Film Industry Development Account.</u>
8	(a) Creation and Purpose of Account. – There is created in the Department of
9	Commerce, Division of Travel and Tourism, the Film Industry Development Account to
10	provide annual grants as incentives to production companies that engage in production
11	activities in this State. The Division of Travel and Tourism shall administer this program
12	in accordance with the following provisions:
13	(1) To be eligible for a grant, a production company must engage in
14	production activities in this State. A grant may not be used for political
15	or issue advertising.

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1	(2) A grant may not exceed fifteen percent (15%) of the amount the
2	production company spends for goods and services in this State during
3	the calendar year.
4	(3) A grant may not exceed two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) per
5	production.
6	(b) Production Company Defined. – As used in this section, the term 'production
7	company' has the meaning provided in G.S. 105-164.3.
8	(c) <u>Reports. – The Department of Commerce shall report annually to the General</u>
9	Assembly concerning the applications made to the account, the payments made from the
10	account, and the effect of the payments on job creation in the State. The Department of
11	Commerce shall also report quarterly to the Joint Legislative Commission on
12	Governmental Operations and the Fiscal Research Division on the use of the moneys in
13	the account, including information regarding to whom payments were made and in what
14	amounts."
15	Section 2. G.S. 143-341(4) is amended by adding a new sub-subdivision to
16	read:
17	"§ 143-341. Powers and duties of Department.
18	The Department of Administration has the following powers and duties:
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20	(4) Real Property Control:
21	
22	o. <u>To provide that no fee, other than reimbursement of actual costs</u>
23	incurred and actual revenues lost by the State, shall be charged
24	when State buildings are made available to a production
25	company for a production. As used in this subdivision, the term
26	'production company' has the meaning provided in G.S. 105-
27	<u>164.3.</u>
28	"
29	Section 3. Article 10 of Chapter 143 of the General Statutes is amended by
30	adding a new section to read:
31	" <u>§ 143-162.2. Use of public property by production companies.</u>
32	If a State agency makes real property available to a production company for a
33	production, it shall not charge any fee other than reimbursement of actual costs incurred
34	and actual revenues lost by the agency. As used in this section, the term 'production
35	company' has the meaning provided in G.S. 105-164.3. This section does not require a
36	State agency to make real property available to a production company for a production."
37	Section 4. G.S. 105-164.3 is amended by adding a new subdivision to read:
38	"(11c) Production company' means a person engaged in the business of
39	making original motion picture, television, or radio images for
40	theatrical, commercial, advertising, or educational purposes."
41	Section 5. G.S. 105-164.13(22a) reads as rewritten:
42	"(22a) Sales of audiovisual masters made or used by a production company in
43	making visual and audio images for first generation reproduction. For

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1	the purpose of this subdivision, an "audiovisual master" is an audio or
2	video film, tape, or disk or another audio or video storage device from
3	which all other copies are made. For the purpose of this subdivision, a
4	production company is a person engaged in the business of making motion
5	picture, television, or radio images for theatrical, commercial, advertising, or
6	educational purposes."
7	Section 6. This act is effective when it becomes law.
