Section 1. C	G.S. 18B-101 is amended by adding a new subdivision to read:
'(<u>14b)</u> <u>Tour</u>	ism resort' means:
<u>a.</u>	Any restaurant and lodging facility owned and operated as a
	resort property offering food, beverage, lodging, and meeting
	facilities to travelers and tourists and featuring one or more golf
	courses and two or more tennis courts along with other
	recreational and sporting activities, or
<u>b.</u>	Any restaurant owned and operated as a resort property offering
	food and beverage to travelers and tourists and featuring an
	equestrian center and two or more tennis courts along with other

recreational and sporting activities.

1		Receipts from sporting and recreational activities of a tourism resort
2		shall be at least twenty-five percent (25%) of total gross receipts
3		Receipts from the sale of alcoholic beverages shall not exceed fifty
4		percent (50%) of total gross receipts. A tourism resort shall advertise at
5		least quarterly in a regional or national travel or sports industry
6		publication, or in the State travel guide published by the North Carolina
7		Department of Commerce."
