2	AN ACT TO P	ERMIT LOCAL AUTHORITIES TO PREEMPT TRAFFIC SIGNALS
3	OR SEMAPHORES ON STATE HIGHWAYS IN EMERGENCY SITUATIONS.	
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:	
5	Section 1. G.S. 20-169 reads as rewritten:	
6	"§ 20-169. Powers of local authorities.	
7	Local authorities, except as expressly authorized by G.S. 20-141 and 20-158, shall	
8	have no power or authority to alter any speed limitations declared in this Article or to	
9	enact or enforce any rules or regulations contrary to the provisions of this Article, except	
10	that local author	ities shall have power to provide by ordinances for <u>any of the following</u> :
11	<u>(1)</u>	the regulation of <u>Regulating</u> traffic by means of traffic or semaphores or
12		other signaling devices and for the preemption of any signaling devices
13		upon city streets or state highways within local government boundaries
14		by the emergency vehicles set forth in G.S. 20-157 on any portion of the
15		highway where traffic is heavy or continuous and may prohibit
16		<u>continuous.</u>
17	<u>(2)</u>	Prohibiting other than one-way traffic upon certain highways, and may
18		regulate-highways.

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1	<u>(3)</u>	Regulating the use of the highways by processions or assemblages and
2		except that local authorities shall have the power to regulate
3		assemblages.
4	<u>(4)</u>	<u>Regulating</u> the speed of vehicles on highways in public parks, but signs
5		<u>parks.</u>
6	Signs shall be erected giving notices of such-the special limits and regulations."	
7	Section 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.
