## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

## AN ACT TO ALLOW A PORTION OF THE 911 CHARGES IN THE EMERGENCY

 TELEPHONE SYSTEM FUND TO BE USED FOR PURPOSES OTHER THAN EQUIPMENT AND RATES ASSOCIATED WITH SUPPLIER SERVICE.The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
SECTION 1. G.S. 62A-8 reads as rewritten:
"§ 62A-8. Payments from Fund.
(a) MoneyFifty percent (50\%) of the monies from the Emergency Telephone System Fund shall be used enly to pay for:
(1) The lease, purchase, or maintenance of emergency telephone equipment, including necessary computer hardware, software and database provisioning, addressing, and nonrecurring costs of establishing a 911 system, and
(2) The rates associated with the service supplier's 911 service and other service supplier recurring charges.
(b) The following expenses are not eligible for payment from the Fumd:Fifty percent (50\%) of the monies from the Emergency Telephone System Fund may be used for the following purposes:
(1) theThe lease or purchase of real estate,estate.
(2) cosmeticCosmetic remodeling of emergency dispatch eenters, centers.
(3) hiring,Hiring, training, and compensating dispatchers, anddispatchers.
(4) theThe purchase of mobile communications vehicles, ambulances, fire engines, or other emergency vehicles.
(c) A local government may contract with a service supplier for any term negotiated by the service supplier and the local government and may make payments from the Emergency Telephone System Fund to provide any payments required by the contract."

SECTION 2. This act applies only to Halifax County.

SECTION 3. This act becomes effective October 1, 2001, and applies to charges billed on or after that date.
