The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
<b>SECTION 1.</b> The Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee shall		
study teacher recruitment and retention. In the course of the study, the Committee shall		
consider:		
(1)	Strategies for expanding the pool of qualified teachers,	
(2)	The use of recruitment and retention incentives to attract an	
high-quality teachers, especially in low-performing schools and in		
fields of certification in which there are shortages of teachers, and		and
(3)	Other strategies for addressing the problem.	
<b>SECTION 2.</b> The Committee shall report the results of this study to the		
2003 General Assembly.		
<b>SECTION 3.</b> There is appropriated from the General Fund to the General		
Assembly the sum of twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) for the 2002-2003 fiscal year to		
implement the provisions of this act.		
<b>SECTION 4.</b> This act becomes effective July 1, 2002.
