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to coordinate such programs with any programs regarding Indian affairs adopted or 1 2 planned by the federal government to the end that the State Commission of Indian 3 Affairs secure the full benefit of such programs; to act as trustee for any interest in real 4 property that may be transferred to the Commission for the benefit of State-recognized 5 Indian tribes; to review all proposed or pending State legislation and amendments to 6 existing State legislation affecting Indians in North Carolina; to conduct public hearings 7 on matters relating to Indian affairs and to subpoena any information or documents 8 deemed necessary by the Commission; to study the existing status of recognition of all 9 Indian groups, tribes and communities presently existing in the State of North Carolina; 10 to establish appropriate procedures to provide for legal recognition by the State of presently unrecognized groups; to provide for official State recognition by the 11 12 Commission of such groups; and to initiate procedures for their recognition by the 13 federal government." 14 SECTION 3. The Commission of Indian Affairs may adopt rules to

15 implement the provisions of this act.

16 **SECTION 4.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
