2	AN ACT TO PRO	OVIDE FOR THE COLLECTION OF TRAFFIC LAW
3	ENFORCEMENT	STATISTICS ON STOPS MADE BY CERTAIN LOCAL LAW
4	ENFORCEMENT A	AGENCIES.
5	The General Assembly	of North Carolina enacts:
6	SECTION 1	I. G.S. 114-10(2a) reads as rewritten:
7	"(2a) To co	llect, correlate, and maintain the following information regarding
8	traffic	c law enforcement by State law enforcement officers:
9	a.	The number of drivers stopped for routine traffic enforcement
10		by State law enforcement officers, the officer making each stop,
11		the date each stop was made, the agency of the officer making
12		each stop, and whether or not a citation or warning was issued;
13	b.	Identifying characteristics of the drivers stopped, including the
14		race or ethnicity, approximate age, and gender;
15	с.	The alleged traffic violation that led to the stop;
16	d.	Whether a search was instituted as a result of the stop;
17	e.	Whether the vehicle, personal effects, driver, or passenger or
18		passengers were searched, and the race or ethnicity,
19		approximate age, and gender of each person searched;
20	f.	Whether the search was conducted pursuant to consent,
21		probable cause, or reasonable suspicion to suspect a crime,
22		including the basis for the request for consent, or the
23		circumstances establishing probable cause or reasonable
24		suspicion;
25	g.	Whether any contraband was found and the type and amount of
26		any such contraband;
27	h.	Whether any written citation or any oral or written warning was
28		issued as a result of the stop;

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1	i. Whether an arrest was made as a result of either the stop or the
2	search;
3	j. Whether any property was seized, with a description of that
4	property;
5	k. Whether the officers making the stop encountered any physical
6	resistance from the driver or passenger or passengers;
7	1. Whether the officers making the stop engaged in the use of
8	force against the driver, passenger, or passengers for any
9	reason;
10	m. Whether any injuries resulted from the stop;
11	n. Whether the circumstances surrounding the stop were the
12	subject of any investigation, and the results of that
13	investigation; and
14	o. The geographic location of the stop; if the officer making the
15	stop is a member of the State Highway Patrol, the location shall
16	be the Highway Patrol District in which the stop was made; for
17	all other law enforcement officers, the location shall be the city
18	or county in which the stop was made.
19	For purposes of this subdivision, "law enforcement officer"
20	means:
21	1. All State law enforcement officers;
22	1.All State law enforcement officers;2.Law enforcement officers employed by county sheriffs
23	or county police departments;
24	3. Law enforcement officers employed by police
25	departments in municipalities with a population of
26	10,000 or more persons; and
27	<u>4.</u> Law enforcement officers employed by police
28	departments in municipalities employing five or more
29	full-time sworn officers for every 1,000 in population.
30	The information required by this subdivision need not be
31	collected in connection with impaired driving checks under G.S.
32	20-16.3A or other types of roadblocks, vehicle checks, or checkpoints
33	that are consistent with the laws of this State and with the State and
34	federal constitutions, except when those stops result in a warning,
35	search, seizure, arrest, or any of the other activity described in
36	sub-subdivisions d. through n. of this subdivision.
37	The identity of the law enforcement officer making the stop
38	required by sub-subdivision a. of this subdivision may be
39	accomplished by assigning anonymous identification numbers to each
40	officer in an agency. The correlation between the identification
41	numbers and the names of the officers shall not be a public record, and
42	shall not be disclosed by the agency except when required by order of
43	a court of competent jurisdiction to resolve a claim or defense properly
44	before the court."

1 SECTION 2. The Division of Criminal Statistics shall establish a procedure 2 and a schedule for the reporting of the information required by this act to the Division. 3 The Division shall print and supply all forms necessary for the collection of this 4 information and shall ensure that local governments providing the Division with this 5 information have the option of doing so by efficient means such as electronic 6 transmission or facsimile.

7 SECTION 3. This act becomes effective January 1, 2002, and applies to law
8 enforcement actions occurring on or after that date.
