A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR THE PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT OF THE CAPE FEAR RIVER FRESHWATER AQUARIUM.

Whereas, the Cape Fear River Watershed is the largest river basin entirely within the State of North Carolina, draining 29 counties or twenty-two percent (22%) of the State's land area, containing approximately twenty-seven percent (27%) of the State's population; and

Whereas, the Cape Fear River is a natural resource of vital economic importance, providing water supply for residential and industrial uses; and

Whereas, the Cape Fear River is used for a variety of recreational activities and for commercial and other waterborne transportation; and

Whereas, the Cape Fear River and its adjacent riparian area serve as a critical fisheries and wildlife habitat; and

Whereas, there is a need to educate and inform others regarding the significance of the Cape Fear River as a natural resource and the need for and benefits of good stewardship; and

Whereas, there is a need for a freshwater aquarium facility for display of this information regarding the Cape Fear River from its headwater tributaries, the Deep and the Haw Rivers, including Jordan Lake, and down to the Cape Fear River Estuary; and

Whereas, the Fayetteville/Cumberland County area is centrally located within the Cape Fear River Basin and is adjacent to Interstate 95; and

Whereas, there is a well-established historical connection between the Cape Fear River and adjacent communities in this area; and

Whereas, this comparatively economically depressed area would benefit from the location of this facility there; and

Whereas, there are educational institutions in this area which can make use of this facility for environmental studies programs; and
