1                                   A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
2 AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA AT  
3 GREENSBORO TO REGULATE PARKING ON CERTAIN STREETS.

4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

5                   **SECTION 1.** G.S. 116-44.5 reads as rewritten:  
6 "**§ 116-44.5. Special provisions applicable to identified constituent institutions of**  
7 **the University of North Carolina.**

8       In addition to the powers granted by ~~G.S. 116-42.1~~G.S. 116-44.4, the board of  
9 trustees of each of the constituent institutions enumerated hereinafter shall have the  
10 additional powers prescribed:

- 11       (1)   The Board of Trustees of the University of North Carolina at Chapel  
12            Hill may by ordinance prohibit, regulate, and limit the parking of  
13            motor vehicles on those portions of the following public streets in the  
14            Town of Chapel Hill where parking is not prohibited by an ordinance  
15            of the Town of Chapel Hill:
- 16            a.     Battle Lane;
  - 17            b.     Country Club Road, between Raleigh Street and South Road;
  - 18            c.     Manning Drive;
  - 19            d.     McCauley Street, between Columbia Street and Pittsboro  
20                 Street;
  - 21            e.     Pittsboro Street, between South Columbia Street and Cameron  
22                 Avenue;
  - 23            f.     Boundary Street, between Country Club Road and East Franklin  
24                 Street;
  - 25            g.     Park Place, between Boundary Street and East Franklin Street;
  - 26            h.     South Columbia Street, between Franklin Street and Manning  
27                 Drive;
  - 28            i.     Cameron Avenue, between South Columbia Street and Raleigh  
29                 Street;

1 j. Raleigh Street;

2 k. Ridge Road;

3 l. South Road, between Columbia Street and Country Club Road.

4 In addition, the Board of Trustees of the University of North Carolina  
5 at Chapel Hill may regulate traffic on Cameron Avenue, between  
6 Raleigh Street and South Columbia Street, and on Raleigh Street, in  
7 any manner not inconsistent with ordinances of the Town of Chapel  
8 Hill.

9 (2) The Board of Trustees of Appalachian State University may by  
10 ordinance prohibit, regulate, and limit the parking of motor vehicles on  
11 those portions of the following public streets in the Town of Boone  
12 where parking is not prohibited by an ordinance of the Town of  
13 Boone:

14 a. Faculty Street, between U.S. 221-U.S. 321 (Hardin Street) and  
15 Water Street;

16 b. Stadium Drive, between Faculty Street and Fernclift Drive;

17 c. College Street, between U.S. 421-U.S. 321 (King Street) and  
18 Locust Street;

19 d. Appalachian Street, between Locust Street and Howard Street;

20 e. Brown Street, between Locust Street and Howard Street.

21 (3) The Board of Trustees of the University of North Carolina at Charlotte  
22 may by ordinance prohibit, regulate, and limit the parking of motor  
23 vehicles on those portions of the following public roads in the County  
24 of Mecklenburg where parking is not prohibited by ordinance or other  
25 source of legal regulation of the County of Mecklenburg or other  
26 governmental entity with jurisdiction to regulate parking on such  
27 public road:

28 a. Mary Alexander Boulevard (State Road No. 2834), between its  
29 intersection with N.C. Highway 49 and its intersection with  
30 Mallard Creek Church Road.

31 In addition, the Board of Trustees of the University of North Carolina  
32 at Charlotte may regulate traffic on Mary Alexander Boulevard (State  
33 Road No. 2834), between its intersection with N.C. Highway 49 and  
34 its intersection with Mallard Creek Church Road, in any manner not  
35 inconsistent with any ordinances or other sources of legal regulation of  
36 the County of Mecklenburg or other governmental entity with  
37 jurisdiction to regulate traffic on such public road.

38 (3a) The Board of Trustees of the University of North Carolina at  
39 Wilmington may by ordinance prohibit, regulate, and limit the parking  
40 of motor vehicles on those portions of the following public streets in  
41 the City of Wilmington where parking is not prohibited by an  
42 ordinance of the City of Wilmington:

- 1 a. "H" Street.
- 2 (3b) The Board of Trustees of the University of North Carolina at
- 3 Greensboro may by ordinance prohibit, regulate, and limit the parking
- 4 of motor vehicles for those portions of any of the following public
- 5 streets in the City of Greensboro where parking is not prohibited by an
- 6 ordinance of the City of Greensboro:
- 7 a. Forest Street between Oakland Avenue and Spring Garden
- 8 Street.
- 9 b. Highland Avenue between Oakland Avenue and Spring Garden
- 10 Street.
- 11 c. Jefferson Street between Spring Garden Street and the
- 12 Walker/Aycock parking lot.
- 13 d. Kenilworth Street between Oakland Avenue and Walker
- 14 Avenue.
- 15 e. McIver Street between Walker Avenue and West Market Street.
- 16 f. Stirling Street between Oakland Avenue and Walker Avenue.
- 17 g. Theta Street between Kenilworth Street and Stirling Street.
- 18 h. Walker Avenue between Aycock Street and Jackson Library
- 19 and between Tate Street and McIver Street.
- 20 (4) This section does not diminish the authority of any affected
- 21 municipality, county or other governmental entity to prohibit parking
- 22 on any public street or road listed herein. It is intended only to
- 23 authorize the respective boards of trustees of the constituent
- 24 institutions identified hereinabove to further prohibit, regulate, and
- 25 limit parking on certain public streets and roads running through or
- 26 adjacent to the campuses of the constituent institutions where parking
- 27 is not prohibited by ordinance or other law of any affected
- 28 municipality, county or other governmental entity. When an ordinance
- 29 or other law of an affected municipality, county or other governmental
- 30 entity is adopted to prohibit parking on any portion of any public street
- 31 or road then regulated by an ordinance of a board of trustees, the
- 32 ordinance of the board of trustees is superseded and the University,
- 33 upon request of the municipality, county or other governmental entity,
- 34 shall immediately remove any signs, devices, or markings erected or
- 35 placed by the University on that portion of the street or road pursuant
- 36 to the superseded ordinance."

37 **SECTION 2.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
