4	The General Ass	sembly of North Carolina enacts:		
5	SECT	TON 1. G.S. 7A-409 reads as rewritten:		
6	6 "§ 7A-409. Composition of State Judicial Council.			
7	(a) The S	State Judicial Council shall consist of 17 18 members as follows:		
8	(1)	The Chief Justice, who chairs the Council;		
9	(2)	The Chief Judge of the Court of Appeals;		
10	(3)	A district attorney chosen by the Conference of District Attorneys;		
11	(4)	A public defender chosen by the public defenders;		
12	(5)	A superior court judge chosen by the Conference of Superior Court		
13		Judges;		
14	(6)	A district court judge chosen by the Conference of District Court		
15		Judges;		
16	(7)	A clerk of superior court chosen by the Association of Clerks of		
17		Superior Court of North Carolina;		
18	(8)	A magistrate appointed by the North Carolina Magistrates'		
19		Association;		
20	(9)	An attorney appointed by the Council of the State Bar;		
21	(10)	One attorney and one nonattorney appointed by the Chief Justice;		
22	(11)	One nonattorney and one attorney appointed by the Governor;		
23	(12)	One nonattorney and one attorney appointed by the General Assembly		
24		upon the recommendation of the Speaker of the House of		
25		Representatives; and		
26	(13)	One nonattorney and one attorney appointed by the General Assembly		
27		upon the recommendation of the President Pro Tempore of the Senate.

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1	(14) A member of the Indigent Defense Services Commission selected by			
2	the Commission.			
3	(b) The Chief Justice and the Chief Judge shall be members of the State Judicial			
4	Council during their terms in those judicial offices. The terms of the other members			
5	selected initially for the State Judicial Council shall be as follows:			
6	(1) One year. – The district court judge, the attorney appointed upon the			
7	recommendation of the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and the			
8	attorney appointed upon the recommendation of the Speaker of the			
9	House of Representatives.			
10	(2) Two years. – The district attorney, the magistrate, the nonattorney			
11	appointed by the Governor, and the nonattorney appointed by the			
12 13	(2) Three wars. The public defender the atterney appointed by the			
13 14	(3) Three years. – The public defender, the attorney appointed by the Council of the State Bar, the nonattorney appointed upon the			
14	recommendation of the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and the			
16	nonattorney appointed upon the recommendation of the Speaker of the			
10	House of Representatives.			
18	(4) Four years. – The superior court judge, the clerk of superior court, the			
19	attorney appointed by the Governor, and the attorney appointed by the			
20	Chief Justice. Justice, and the member appointed by the Indigent			
21	Defense Services Commission.			
22	After these initial terms, the members of the State Judicial Council shall serve terms			
23	of four years. All terms of members shall begin on January 1 and end on December 31.			
24	No member may serve more than two consecutive full terms. Any vacancy on the			
25	Council shall be filled by a person appointed by the official or entity who appointed the			
26	person vacating the position.			
27	(c) If an official or entity is authorized to appoint more than one member of the			
28	State Judicial Council, the members appointed by that official or entity must reside in			
29	different judicial districts.			
30	(d) No incumbent member of the General Assembly or incumbent judicial			
31	official, other than the ones specifically identified by office in subsection (a) of this			
32	section, may serve on the State Judicial Council.			
33	(e) The appointing authorities shall confer with each other and attempt to arrange			
34	their appointments so that the members of the State Judicial Council fairly represent			
35	each area of the State, both genders, and each major racial group."			
36	SECTION 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 2001, and the term of the			
37	member added to the Judicial Council by this act begins on that date.
